Scanning Notes

This information is for the keen reader who may note a discontinuity in actual page count with page numbering on this issue.

This issue employs a unique page numbering scheme based on material value of chess pieces. For instance page 5 is numbered with a Rook symbol and page 9 is marked with a Queen symbol. The copy loaned to the TCA for scanning is a stapled 8.5 x 11 ten page document. It appears to be quite old with a rusty staple and foxed paper.

Based on the numbering system, there is no page 7 in this document. Whether this was a numbering error and there never was a page 7 or whether the page is truly missing is unclear. There is no continuity break in reading the issue. However, the very last sentence on the last page of this issue alludes to a back cover page that is not in this document either.

Lou Thurston scored a clean 5-0 to take 1st over eight 4-point scorers, including Art Riley (2nd), Tony Alston (3rd), Carl Clayton (1st A and Top Collegiate), Phillip Neeley (1st B), Ed Del Rio (1st C), Charles Hayden (1st High School), Jack Beaners and Clifford Dean. Noe Garza was named "Top Jr. High", Bruce Neal won the Tiebreak over Miguel Lucio for 1st D, and D. Williamson took 1st Unrated. TD Ken McClellen was assisted by Steve Alden.

The Vidor Chess Club announces these standings in an informally scheduled 16-player round-robin in progress: in first, Sam Lovett (Port Arthur - 1796), $9\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$; in second, Ronald Enard (Orange - 1848), $8\frac{1}{2}-\frac{1}{2}$; in third, Kevin Hammon (Beaumont - 1996), $8\frac{1}{2}-1\frac{1}{2}$; in fourth, Don Hegele (Beaumont - 2008), 12-3; and, in fifth, Fred King (Nederland - 1749), $8\frac{1}{2}-2\frac{1}{2}$. The third section's honors wnet cleanly to Robert Comacho ($2\frac{1}{2}$) with Frank Dick (2) taking home 2nd. Lance Thomas made a 3 in the third to take 1st and Jack Howard lost one but gained 2nd. Unrated Rudy Pena picked up a 1st place trophy in the final section over 2nd place Jesse Flores. Ernest Templer was named Top Active Military (2), Morris Samuelson (808!), Top Junior (3!), and Marco Lopez, 2nd Junior ($2\frac{1}{2}$). Harmon Throneberry directed this event.
