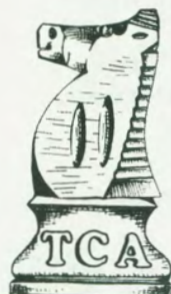

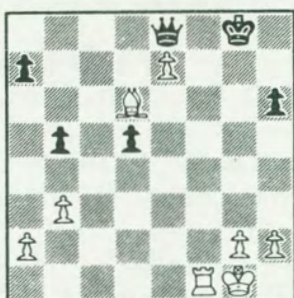

mayor of New Orleans made Bills's
first move 1. N-QB3.

Alan Laverty vs Robert Atlas
At first blush it appears White is in a hurry to catch a train, going for a quick kill, but the score sheet indicates that one move before resignation, the first player consumed 66 minutes while the second 24.

Three by Dale Dike

Finishing with 5 points, Dale faced a tough schedule. His starting rating of 2075 was enhanced several dozen points and is within striking distance of the coveted masterhood.

Finally, thirdly, and most probably:

A fun game, a funny game. Black, slipping into a poor game, suddenly repulses White, tries for too much, and the tables are turned once more.

Nevertheless, White may have a modicum more King safety than Black - small consolation), PxP(?) 15 O-O, Q-KB4(?) 16 Q-R4ch, K-Q1 17 B-K3, P-KR3 18 BxN, PxN 19 Q-R5ch, K-K1 20 BxP/K5, N-N5 21 Q-N5ch, K-B2 22 P-B3 (you see it coming, but what can you go about it? If 22...QxB 23 PxNch, K-K3 24 Q-B4ch and Black's chances of survival in the middle game are poor and his endgame is no great smacks either.)

There is a danger in this position which may be alleviated by some such move as 20...R-QB1, but it is hidden at this moment and revealed instanter.

Another Queen move with a double attack threat, this time against the Black N and KBP

21...Q-K1 22 Q-B4ch, K-N2 23 NxNP, N-Q4 24 BxN, KPxB 25 N-R4! and Black might have tried 25...B-B1 for some prolongation attempt, but instead played: 25...Q-K3? 26 Q-N5ch resigns.

Eight-move combo *

The following game features White planning to trap Black's queen. The second players acquiesces in this, but a series checks ensnares the hapless White King!

Black waits. He is safe on the K-side, strong in the center, and has his own future King side attack hidden in the wings. Unfortunately for White, 25 a5 is tactically unfeasible.

25 Qa2 Ba5 26 Nd4 (already eyeing Ne6) Bd2 27 Qd2 Re7 28 Rb3 Rg7!?

White should realize that Black can see a one-move threat and look further.

(Algeo v Gamble)

29 Ne6: Qe6 30 Bh7ch Kh7 31 Re6 Rg2 ch
 And now White must really play with extreme caution. Instead of capturing, 31 Kh1 is a poor choice: 31...Nb6! wins. The other choice is 31 Kf1 putting the question to Black to which there is no answer, only wiggles(31...Ba8)
 32 Kg2?Ne3ch 33 Kg3 Rg5ch 34 Kh4 Nf5ch 35 Kh3 Bg2 mate.

* I didn't say it was sound, but the final picture is piquant.

Texans should be proud of Maria Ivanka's performance in the 1980 Olympiads at Malta. She scored 8 wins, 6 draws and 0 losses, for 78.6%!!

After five rounds in the women's competition, Hungary scored 12½ of 15. The USSR and Romania trailed with 10½.

After twelve rounds, Hungary led the USSR 28 to 27½ with only two rounds to play. If Hungary could score 4½ of 6, they would win. However, the USSR scored 5 of 6 to Hungary's 4 of 6 to take the women's event by one-half point.

The final standings for the women: USSR 32½-9½, Hungary 32-10, Poland 26½-15½, Romania 26-16, China and West Germany 24-18, Israel and Yugoslavia 23½-18½.

The Hungarian men's team suffered an even closer margin of defeat for first place. Although tied with the USSR at 39-17, the Hungarians lost first on tie break 449½ to 449!

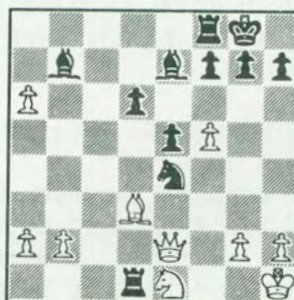

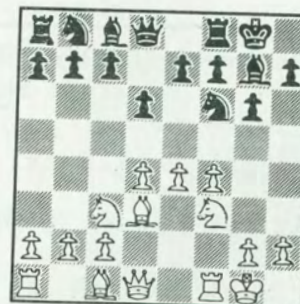

About here you may be asking yourself what happened to Texas Knights. Where's Mednis? Where's Brieger's follow-up to The Adjudicator's Quiz? Where did the other eight pages go? The photos? The graphics?

The answer lies within the financial report from TCA secretary-treasurer, Charles Davis.

"Texas Knights funding.....if we continue to publish TK...at the current cost, we would require 950 members @\$5.00 each to publish on a bi-monthly basis, or 1187 members on a \$4.00 annual renewal basis to sustain its publication.

"The 950 or 1200 membership is possible to attain. However, we have published and mailed out two issues and as a result have shown an increase in new and renewed members of only 57 members since last accounting in August, 1980. We now have 561 members who are current..."

The nitty gritty is that one issue of TK like the last one costs in the neighborhood of \$900, printing, mailing, all. (Granted we mailed out one issue to all expired members as a promotion -- 1000 copies).

Our checking account balance as of Dec. 31, 1980 was \$1,083.29. It doesn't take a C.P.A. to tell us we are walking on thin ice.

There are some bugs in the system, as Doonesbury might say. For example: Sixty (60, that is) Texans walked away from the last Southwest Open still owing TCA dues. We even know who they are -- even know how they "escaped."

I was tempted to white-out their names on the crosstable as a cheapshot.

Worse news is this: Many ex-TCA members --who play in TCA events-- see no value in the organization -- see no value in the magazine. An informal poll among them indicated that the only things they would want to see in TK are cross tables, unannotated games, and news of state chess events. Period.

News of statewide chess events can be found in the tournament guide section of Chess Life, of course.

Crosstables can be purchased for \$3.00 from USCF. (Much less expensive than the cost per page of the SWO in this issue).

Unannotated games come by the batch in books, can be purchased from West Coast purveyors by the tournament load.

So, then, what should a state magazine be? As your editor, I put together my ideas in the past two issues.

This one comes up short in every way. But then, so does our bank balance.

So much for the sermon from Mount Bonnell. What's needed here is a solution.

Some have suggested that we print up a montly one-or-two page newsletter, bare bones. (This forgets that the postage would double or triple, depending on bi-monthly or quarterly publication to monthly).

Others encouraged a membership drive. I tried this on the national level. I think I'll pass on this one.

Illinois came up with a patron membership -- \$25 minimum donation -- which includes a monthly listing in the Illinois Chess Bulletin and a first-class mailing. This worked rather well for Illinois and is worth a try here, I believe. Think about it.

Late news: Hübner's withdrawal from the match. I called a couple of people about this. IM Bill Martz was on scene until a few days before the end. Everything looked "fine" at that time. Bill came back state-side and called in for the games. The 7th found Hübner making a "crucial oversight".

On the mend: Ken Smith, Linda Smith, and Art Riley. I've talked with all of them and report that they sound chipper after their respective hospital stays. I know you join me in wishing them continued improvement.
